2022 STATED MEETING AT SYNOD

IWU Campus (Marion, IN) on Tuesday 6/21/22 @ 1:15 p.m.

The Great Lakes-Gulf Presbytery met for its stated annual meeting during the RPCNA Synod on Tuesday June 21, 2022 on the campus of Indiana Wesleyan University in Marion, Indiana at 1:15 p.m.

1. CALL TO ORDER

The moderator, Nathan Eshelman, called the court to order at 1:15 p.m., constituting the court in prayer.

2. ATTENDANCE

The assistant clerk, Dale Koons, called the attendance roll and confirmed that a quorum was present.

3. CLERK'S REPORT

Adam Kuehner presented the clerk's report, bringing its recommendations before the court.

- Recommendation 11 was seconded and adopted.
- Recommendation 2² was seconded and adopted.
- Recommendation 3³ was seconded and adopted.
- Recommendation 44 was seconded and adopted.
- Recommendation 5⁵ was seconded and adopted.
- Recommendation 66 was seconded and adopted.
- Recommendation 77 was seconded and adopted.
- Recommendations 88 and 99 were automatically referred to the fall meeting.
- Recommendation 10¹⁰ was seconded and adopted.

4. GLG 22-13 ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Steve Rhoda presented the report of the GLG 22-13 Advisory Committee, bringing its recommendations before the court.

- Following some discussion, it was moved and seconded that presbytery lay Rec. 1¹² on the table to entertain a substitute: That presbytery rule that the evidence presented in GLG 22-13 is insufficient to warrant a trial for a censurable offense.
- The substitute motion was discussed and adopted, with Kent Butterfield and Drew Poplin registering their dissent.¹³
- It was moved, seconded, and adopted to approve the report.¹⁴

5. MOTION TO EXTEND THE TIME

It was moved, seconded, and adopted to extend the time for fifteen minutes.

6. IRPC SLANDER-LIBEL COMMITTEE

Ross Fearing presented the report of the IRPC Slander-Libel Committee, bringing its recommendations before the court.

- Recommendation 115 was discussed and failed.
- Recommendation 2¹⁶ was discussed and failed by a vote of 15-16.
- Recommendation 3¹⁷ was discussed, after which it was moved, seconded, and adopted to adjourn the meeting.

7. PRAYER OF ADJOURNMENT

The moderator adjourned the court in prayer at 2:28 p.m.

¹³ Butterfield-Poplin Dissent: "We write to express our dissent from the following action of Presbytery, 21 June 2022: 'That presbytery rule that the evidence presented in GLG 22-13 is insufficient to warrant a trial for a censurable offense.' Our Lord Jesus said in Matthew 12:36-37, 'But I say unto you, That every idle word that men shall speak, they shall give account thereof in the day of judgment. For by thy words thou shalt be justified, and by thy words thou shalt be condemned.' During the Spring Meeting of Great Lakes- Gulf Presbytery, Mr. Faris's speech referenced in GLG 22-13 was uncharitable, untrue and not Christlike in every respect when he spoke with accusations of sins against families who have engaged the Christ Church RP Session and cooperated with the Presbytery Reconciliation Committee. These comments are not to be merely overlooked as hasty words stated in the passion of Presbytery deliberations, but as sins worthy of censure by the court of this Church. James 3:1, 6 says, 'My brethren, be not many masters, knowing that we shall receive the greater condemnation . . . And the tongue is a fire, a world of iniquity: so is the tongue among our members, that it defileth the whole body, and setteth on fire the course of nature; and it is set on fire of hell.' Elders have a higher degree of accountability due to their office. We must never overlook the speech of an elder that speaks disparagingly of a member in good standing of the church. As it says in Colossians 4:6, 'Let your speech be always with grace, seasoned with salt, that ye may know how ye ought to answer every man.' Our Presbytery in its deliberation and by this action has contradicted the holy Law of God, and forsaken the example and teaching of our Lord Jesus. By this action, our Presbytery has demonstrated that it has a lower expectation of her ministers than it has of her members - for while this court would not even take up the charges against Mr. Faris, yet we were willing to have a committee to investigate aggrieved families of slander and libel. This ought not be so. The deliberation and actions of this court show that we care more for the reputation of our elders than taking seriously the injustice done and grief bought by Mr. Faris' public comments toward these families. For the purity and progress of the Church, Kent Butterfield and Drew Poplin, 22 June 2022"

2022 SPECIAL MTG AFTER SYNOD

IWU Campus (Marion, IN) on Friday 6/24/22 @ 12:30 p.m.

The Great Lakes-Gulf Presbytery met for a special meeting following synod's adjournment on Friday June 24, 2022 at 12:30 p.m. on the campus of Indiana Wesleyan University in Marion, Indiana.¹⁸

1. CALL TO ORDER

The moderator, Nathan Eshelman, called the court to order at 12:32 p.m., noting that the report of the IRPC Slander-Libel Committee will be resumed at the upcoming fall meeting in order to accommodate our IRPC delegates who were not able to be present for this meeting.

2. VISUAL ATTENDANCE

The assistant clerk, Dale Koons, took visual attendance, confirming that a quorum was present.

3. PERSONAL PRIVILEGE

Home Mission Board representative Bryan Dage shared some information on behalf of the Home Mission Board.

4. CANDIDATES & CREDENTIALS COMMITTEE

Adam Niess presented the Candidates and Credentials Committee report, bringing its recommendations before the court.

- Recommendation 119 was adopted.
- Recommendation 2²⁰ was adopted, to be carried out later in the meeting.
- Recommendations 3²¹ and 4²² were referred to the fall meeting.

SERMON EXAM (Ord.) — J. Smith (UNANIMOUSLY SUSTAINED) RCV

At the moderator's direction, Pastor Kyle Borg of the Winchester Reformed Presbyterian Church (Midwest Presbytery, RPCNA) led the court in prayer for Josh Smith's ordination-level sermon exam, and floor privileges were subsequently granted by the court to all RPCNA elders.

- Josh Smith came forward to preach his ordination-level sermon exam, called upon God's name in a prayer of illumination, read 1 Thessalonians 2:1-12, preached from the text on Paul's pastoral care in Thessalonica, and concluded in prayer, after which comments were received, and the exam was unanimously sustained by roll call vote.

CHURCH HISTORY PAPER — J. Schwartz (SUSTAINED)W

Josh Reshey presented the report of the committee to review Jake Schwartz's church history paper, and the paper was sustained by voice vote.

HEBREW EXEGESIS PAPER — A. Murray (SUSTAINED)VV

Shawn Anderson presented the report of the committee to review Aaron Murray's Hebrew exegesis paper, and the paper was sustained by voice vote.

BIBLE EXAM — N. Shaver (SUSTAINED)VV

Joel Hart reported that Nathan Shaver passed his Bible exam, and the exam was sustained by voice vote.

HEBREW EXEGESIS PAPER — A. Blackwood (SUSTAINED)W

Joel Hart presented the report of the committee to review Allen Blackwood's Hebrew exegesis paper, and the paper was sustained by voice vote.

LICENSURE TO RECEIVE A CALL — A. Murray (UNANIMOUSLY SUSTAINED) RCV

Aaron Murray's licensure to receive a call was unanimously sustained by roll call vote.23

- James Faris administered the licensure queries to Aaron Murray, who affirmed them and signed the queries in the minute book, after which Joel Hart called upon God's name in prayer, licensing Mr. Murray as eligible to receive a call to the gospel ministry in the name and by the authority of Zion's only Head and King, Jesus Christ.
- Joel Hart issued a charge to Mr. Murray, after which the clerk presented Mr. Murray with a pastoral call from the Coldenham-Newburgh congregation (RPCNA), instructing him to give his response to the court within two weeks.

LICENSURE TO RECEIVE A CALL — A. Blackwood (UNANIMOUSLY SUSTAINED) RCV

Allen Blackwood's licensure to receive a call was unanimously sustained by roll call vote.

- Joel Hart administered the licensure queries to Allen Blackwood, who affirmed them and signed the queries in the minute book, after which Bob Bibby called upon God's name in prayer, licensing Mr. Blackwood as eligible to receive a call to the gospel ministry in the name and by the authority of Zion's only Head and King, Jesus Christ.
- Ed Blackwood issued a charge to his son, Mr. Blackwood, after which the clerk presented Mr. Blackwood with a pastoral call from the Laramie congregation (RPCNA), and he indicated his decision to accept the call.

PERSONAL GODLINESS EXAM (Ord.) — J. Smith (UNANIMOUSLY SUSTAINED) RCV

Josh Smith came forward to receive his ordination-level personal godliness exam from Steve Rhoda, who asked Mr. Smith questions and received answers, after which questions and comments were received from the floor and the exam was unanimously sustained by roll call vote.

SYSTEMATIC THEOLOGY EXAM (Ord.) — J. Smith (UNANIMOUSLY SUSTAINED) RCV

Josh Smith received his ordination-level systematic theology and distinctive principles exam from Philip McCollum, who asked Mr. Smith questions and received answers.

- Following the time for questions from the floor, it was moved, seconded, and adopted to permit a delegate to ask Mr. Smith if he takes any personal exceptions to the RPCNA subordinate doctrinal standards.
- Mr. Smith responded, after which comments were received and the exam was unanimously sustained by roll call vote.

ORDINATION ROLL CALL — J. Smith (UNANIMOUSLY SUSTAINED)RCV

The court unanimously sustained Josh Smith's ordination by roll call vote.

CARE STATUS INTERVIEW — C. Work (SUSTAINED)^{VV}

Cody Work shared his personal testimony of saving faith and internal call to the gospel ministry, after which questions and comments were received from the floor and the motion to receive him as a student under care was adopted by voice vote.

Recommendation 5²⁴ was adopted, thereby receiving the report of the Candidates and Credentials Committee.

5. MOTION FROM THE FLOOR

It was moved, seconded, and adopted that presbytery appoint a five-man commission to ordain and install Josh Smith as a teaching elder on Friday August 19, 2022 at the Westminster Reformed Presbyterian Church in Prairie View, Illinois, consisting of the following delegates: Jack Baumgartner (ch.), Jerry Foltz, Bob Koch, Steve Rhoda, and Craig Scott.

6. MOTION TO ADJOURN

It was moved, seconded, and adopted to adjourn the meeting.

7. READING OF THE MINUTES

The clerk read the minutes (6/21, 6/24), and it was moved, seconded, and passed to adopt the minutes as amended.

8. PRAYER OF ADJOURNMENT

Bob Koch called upon God's name in prayer, adjourning the meeting at 3:38 p.m.²⁵
