This last year our session read and discussed Tim Keller's "Walking with God in Pain and Suffering" which has been beneficial in many ways. We want to be better prepared to comfort and encourage the flock of God as we face various trials individually and corporately. Our hope is to be able to endure trials to the point of rejoicing (Rom. 5:3-4).

Statistically speaking, the session constituted as a court 14 times in 2019 and met informally many other times for counsel and discussion. Sycamore RPC currently has 35 communicant members and 30 baptized members. We witnessed 11 baptisms (L. Anderson; 5 Rudds; G. Estok, N. Stodgell, 3 Kilpatricks). We dismissed Ben Visser from membership as he plans to relocate to Beaver Falls to work. Sadly, we also excommunicated Andy and Sarah Joseph. May the Lord be merciful and restore these lost sheep to Himself. We witnessed the Lord add the Desautels, Howard, Rudd, Stodgell, and Wachs households into membership! We saw attendance averages of 57 people in the morning service, and 37 in the evening teaching service (52 and 31 in 2019). We also rejoice for 3 new deacons (Brian Anderson, Patrick Blue, and Brentt VanSickle) joining our lone deacon, Sam Morrow on our Deacon Board.

Regarding our preaching & teaching ministry, we have seen the glory and experienced the grace of our Triune God as we have walked through Romans 6-8. We also considered Church Membership and a number of one-off sermons. Guest preachers included Chris Myers, Jason Camery, Rich Johnston, Steven Work, HP McCracken, Bill Robert, Aaron Murray, Kyle Borg, and Barry York. We celebrated the Lord's Supper 6 times, twice participating in Communion Weekends (Three Divine Sisters: Faith, Hope, and Love; Doxology of Jude). In our evening teaching service, we considered the "I AM" Sayings of Jesus (Ligonier), The Life of Elijah, and The Church of Ephesus (Rev 2.1-7). We sang consecutively through Psalms 96D to 109B.

We also kept a teaching schedule during the week, including Bible Survey then Knowing Scripture (Mon); Romans then Psalms for women (Thur); and Calvin's 'Little Book on the Christian Life', Ligonier's 'Doctrines of Grace in John', then Ferguson's 'Maturity' for men (Thurs); Knowing Scripture

(Thurs PM). Apart from weekly Biblical counseling, I have been involved in tutoring the '8th grade' community for Classical Conversations each Wednesday.

Within the church, we enjoyed many times of fellowship, including a 4th of July Backyard Fellowship (McKissicks), an Airshow & Fall Party (Blues), an open house at the Desautels, and a Chili Cook-off at the VanSickles. (Congrats Aaron!). We celebrated the Lord's Supper 6 times, twice making use of Communion Weekends on the 3 Virtues: Faith, Hope, and Love (Feb, Pastor Anderson) then on the Doxology in Jude (Oct, Pastor Kyle Borg). Most significantly, in November we enjoyed our 25th Anniversary Weekend Memorial with Dr. Barry York. The session is very thankful for the Hospitality Committee as they often served in these events. We made some progress in family visitation, meeting with over half of our households.

Within the Presbytery, we hosted the CORPS Winter conference, we got together for the RP night at Victory Field (Indy), some of us attended Covfamikoi presbytery conference, the presbytery women's retreat, and we joined the northern RP churches for our annual Thanksgiving Psalm sing.

We continue to pray for and support the Pregnancy Resource Center where Suzanne Jones serves as assistant director now in Kokomo. We enjoyed their annual "Walk for Life" and "Banquet for Life". We are thankful that Robert Jones can incorporate our building to our community as a service to Lifeline Family Services and their clients. Shawn continues to host Bible studies with folks in the community looking for Biblical counseling.

Our hope and prayer is that the Lord would continue to bless us with Himself in 2020, as well as His benediction of His love, grace, and fellowship so that we would continue to "know that God causes all things to work together for good to those who love God, to those who are called according to His purpose' which is "to be conformed to the image of His Son" (Rom 8.28-29).
