Dear Fathers and Brethren,

We are grateful to the Lord for His many mercies to our congregation over the past year. Here are some of the highlights.

- 1. In 2024, our membership grew to 103, an increase of 44% since the end of 2021.
- 2. In addition to weekly sermons (AM: <u>Romans</u>, <u>Isaiah</u>; PM: <u>Heir of the World</u>, <u>Jonah</u>, <u>Christ's Kingship</u>) and Psalm meditations, we conducted a sabbath school teaching series on <u>Theology Proper</u>.
- 3. Following more than a decade without deacons, the congregation overwhelmingly elected two new deacons (M. Molik, J. D'Amato), who were ordained in April and served faithfully throughout the year.
- 4. Pastor Kuehner led pre-seminary Zoom studies on *Presbyterian Ecclesiology II/III:*Durham/Spear (Spring/Fall '24) with a combined total of 15+ participants, including various RP pastors, members, and prospective future officers, both local and denominational. In Spring 2025, the group plans to study *Covenant Theology I*, using the first volume of Francis Roberts' *God's Covenants: The Mystery & Marrow of the Bible*.
- 5. One of our members, Matt Fernandez, moved to Japan to attend Tokyo Christian University with an eye toward the possibility of future pastoral ministry. Another of our members, A.J. Troutman, began online courses at Reformation Bible College.
- 6. In addition to 'fifth Sabbath' evangelistic services, members led chapel services at the Christian Guidance Center in Detroit, evangelized outside local abortion clinics, and engaged in open-air outreach in Plymouth and Pontiac.
- 7. The Session led midweek meetings for prayer and Bible study in Southfield and Troy, though attendance at these meetings has dipped below 20% of our total membership. We are presently exploring ways to increase midweek participation.
- 8. Pastor Kuehner took a research/writing sabbatical¹ during Q4 (Oct-Dec)—No S.S. teaching, morning preaching, or midweek lessons—with Rev. Samul preaching an 11-part morning series on Isaiah 1-7.
- Due to unprecedented demand for occasional/ongoing pastoral meetings with members and adherents, the Session was unable to do systematic visitation in 2024.²
- 10. This past year, Elder Kim's parents, Rev. Peter and Joy Kim, entered their heavenly

- rest, concluding a season of intense caregiving within the Kim household, and commencing a season of renewed service and involvement within the congregation.
- 11. Returning from his sabbatical, Pastor Kuehner has taken steps to reduce his role in teaching the adult sabbath school and in leading midweek meetings. Combined with his retirement from the GLGP clerkship in March, it is hoped that he will have more time to help meet the increasing demand for local shepherding and discipleship.
- 12. The Session excommunicated Gary Allison, suspended a brother (drunkenness, fornication), and maintained the suspension of another brother (fornication), while helping these two men through a process of repentance and restoration.
- 13. Pastor Kuehner continues to lead a weekly men's accountability group, which the Lord has used mightily to empower victory over sin. Prior to that, he led a communicant membership class for adherents and covenant children.
- 14. Our total membership (as of 12/31/24) increased from 85 to 103, with an average morning worship attendance of 86 (in-person), an average evening worship attendance of 53 (in-person).³
- 15. We praise God for blessing us with yet another all-time high in total income for 2024 (\$215,188): an increase of nearly 12% from 2023.
- 16. We are thankful to God for His rich blessing, recognizing our great need to maintain humble vigilance, as we seek to "fear the LORD and His goodness" in 2025.

³ For the second consecutive year, our in-person evening worship attendance has declined. This decline is primarily due to several factors during 2024: (1) Six of our households bore significant caregiving responsibilities, (2) A notable increase in households with *multiple* young children (one of whom is occasionally sick), (3) Complicated mixed-marriage and step-parent situations, which impact worship attendance; (4) Our reception of Rev. Yang and his family, who reside in Grand Rapids, (5) Our 2-3 households who live 50+ minutes from the church cannot regularly attend evening worship, and (6) The bulk of our new members were received toward the back-end of 2024. Thanks to our livestream, folks are better able to cope with some of these challenges than in the past. With that said, our evening service is a bustling event, with a vast majority of folks sticking around for an hour (or more) of snacks and fellowship. In addition, to help make evening service more convenient (especially for single folks), several of our young adults typically remain at the church for lunch and fellowship in between services. Thankfully, more recent trends in evening worship attendance have been more encouraging.
